London Symphonia fondly remembers Sigmar Martin, an accomplished violinist and much-loved, respected and committed musician and teacher. We send our heartfelt condolences to his family, friends, and to all who have had the pleasure of knowing and working with him.

Starting in 1981, Sigmar was principal second violinist, and often a soloist, with Orchestra London where he also performed alongside his brother, Mel Martin, now core violinist of London Symphonia. Mel noted that he "was constantly bringing music out into the community...he was just willing to try things, take chances and everything he did, he did with enthusiasm." Over his career with Orchestra London, Joe Lanza, now concert master of London Symphonia, worked closely with Sigmar. "He put so much energy into everything, and he was such a committed force in the Orchestra London, a real leader," Lanza said.



"He was absolutely invested in the orchestra, and the reason was he believed in music and the power of music. He believed in music education, and he believed in the idea that sharing what we did and the art of it and the beauty of it made the world a better place."

Unfortunately, due to a backlog at the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services which processes the P2 files this is a source of frustration for our members seeking to perform in the United States. While this situation is out of the Unions control there is lobbying from the American Federation of Musicians to the U.S. government in hopes of helping to highlight the effect on our members.

A committee formed from the Executive Board has been working on updating the LMA "Tariff of Fees" and will be presenting the new fee structure for a vote to accept them at the upcoming general membership meeting. It has been a few years since it has been updated, and we look forward to our members being paid higher rates for performing.


Musician Drummer Percussionist
